

## HILLSONG 06 TO LAUNCH MIGHTY TO SAVE

Hillsong Church releases its latest live worship album *Mighty to Save* at the Hillsong Conference 3-7 July.

*Mighty to Save* features worship leaders Darlene Zschech, Reuben Morgan, Joel Houston, and Marty Sampson.

Hillsong recorded the 14-track CD at the Sydney Entertainment Centre in March with more than 10 000 worshippers participating.

## PHIL DRISCOLL CONVICTED

A US Federal Court has found gospel singer/trumpeter Phil Driscoll guilty on conspiracy to avoid paying income taxes, plus two counts of income tax evasion.

Associated Press says that Driscoll, 58, faces up to 15 years in jail (five years for each conviction). He will be sentenced in October.

The jury ruled his wife, Lynne Driscoll, not guilty of conspiracy, and not guilty of one count of tax evasion.

But, the jury deadlocked on another tax evasion charge she faced. Ms. Driscoll will be retried on that count.

The Driscolls remain free on bond.

The 8-piece performs around 200 dates a year and continues to build their loyal and appreciative fan base.

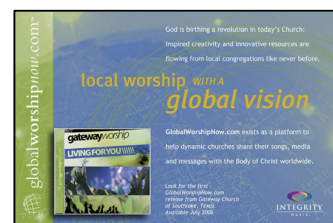
Salvador's most recent single, *Heaven*, was Top 5 for 18 weeks on US AC radio, and was the 4th most played song of 2005!
